

## QUEENSLAND PREMIER TO LAUNCH SPECIAL WEEK AT AICHI

Queensland Premier Peter Beattie will launch Queensland Week at World Expo in Aichi, Japan on Monday, 11 April.

"We expect about 150,000 people to visit the Australian Pavilion during Queensland Week (11-17 April), for an exciting taste of Australia's Smart State," Mr Beattie said.

"I look forward to personally greeting visitors to the Pavilion, and inviting them to come to Queensland for a unique holiday experience, a business opportunity, or as a student at one of our excellent schools, colleges and universities.

"Queensland is the best place for an Australian experience: a natural place renowned for wellness and healing, and for unique animals, World Heritage-listed areas, resorts, healthy food, wine and star gazing.

"Visitors to the Australian Pavilion will see more of Queensland's amazing environment, including the Great Barrier Reef.

"During Queensland Week they will watch dinosaurs being brought to life by a brilliant Queensland dinosaur builder, and see the amazing Jurassic Tree (Wollemi pine).

"Queensland Week is also an opportunity for a family to win a five-night holiday flying Australian Airlines to Cairns, where the Reef meets the Rainforest.

"I encourage everyone to enter so they can discover what millions of people already know: that Queensland is the smart choice for tourism, business and study," Premier Beattie said.


