The countdown is on for the very special one-millionth person to visit to the Canada Pavilion. The early arrival of this milestone may be an indication that the Canada Pavilion will exceed its initial overall objective of 1.5 M visitors before the end of Expo 2005 on September 25<sup>th</sup>. This figure was based on 10 % of the total number of estimated visitors to the Expo site, which is 15 million.
