Performing on the Global Common 2 Stage

September 17: Darren Sigesmund Quintet (11:30 am)

Canadian trombonist and composer Darren Sigesmund is emerging as a significant new voice on the Canadian and international music scene after having completed successful tours of Asia and Western Canada. He leads an exciting quintet project entitled, Strands, which features his original compositions. Strands conveys a dynamic blend of Jazz, Latin and Classical influences. September 18-20: Jimmy Bowskill (3:30 pm)

Jimmy Bowskill, 15-year-old blues virtuoso from Ontario, taught himself to play and sing by interpreting by sight and sound but in his own natural style. He burst onto the music scene at the tender age of 11 when he was invited to join Canadian icon Jeff Healey onstage, and he has continued to play with top musicians ever since. Jimmy has taken Canada by storm, touring and performing across the country, notably at the world-renowned Montréal Jazz Festival and the Tremblant Blues Festival. Jimmy's incredible success story has been profiled on several national and regional television programs, and he has already released two albums. His most recent release, *Soap Bars & Dog Ears*, has been nominated for a prestigious Juno Award, Canada's top honour in the world of music. What makes Jimmy so special as a performer is not only his young age but his incredibly mature soul. Don't miss your chance to see this young performer as he takes the stage at Expo 2005. September 18-20: **BLOU (12:30 pm)**

The story of Acadian band **BLOU** begins at a music festival in Nova Scotia in 1994, where

the Acadian people fell in love with them right away. Lead by Patrice Boulianne, **BLOU** made its way across Acadia, playing at numerous cultural festivals, events, cabarets, and nightclubs before they became a quintet in 1997. In 1998, the group released its first album, *Acadico*, which was published under independent label and was a great success in the Atlantic Provinces and across the nation. In 1999, BLOU had the honour of becoming the first Acadian group to have an album in circulation in France, giving them international status. Since then, BLOU has toured all over the world. In Canada, they are well loved by both the French and English-speaking public. They have been recognized for their talent and uniqueness by several awards and prizes, including the 2003 ZOF Award for the Francophone Canadian artist most recognized on the international market. BLOU will also be featured in a special concert on September 21 with blues virtuoso Jimmy Bowskill and rock star Sam Roberts. For more information on BLOU, please visit www.blou.ca.

Formed in 1998, Similia is composed of identical twins Nadia Labrie, who plays the flute, and Annie Labrie, who plays the guitar. The duo specializes in contemporary Canadian repertoire, which they interpret with flamboyant energy and great sensitivity. Born in Québec, both Nadia and Annie were classically trained at top Canadian music institutions and found tremendous success in their solo careers before their talent and passion for music brought them together as Similia. In addition to countless performances in North America, Annie and Nadia have captivated audiences in Europe and in Mexico. As Duo Similia, they have already released two albums on the Analekta label, which are distributed in Japan and around the world. Their recent release *Nota Del Sol* was extremely well-received and earned the pair a prestigious 2004 Felix Award, given by the ADISQ, organization representing Québec companies and professionals of the record, entertainment, and video industry. On top of their performances on Global Commons 2, Similia will join an impressive line-up of Canadian classical artists on September 24 for a special concert at Expo Hall.
