Last 3 days at the NGO Global Village

NGO Global Village, situated at the foot of the enormous ferris wheel (with a giant LED panel in the middle) in the Fun and Participation Area, is a pavilion where 30 civic groups, all NPO(Non Profit Organization)s and NGO(Non Government Organization)s, are present. These groups initiate visitors into environmental and sustainability notions in an attempt to realize the concept of "learning for sustainability" by offering participatory programs with strong emphasis on face-to-face communication. The issues treated vary, among others; environmental education, aborigine cultures, city greenery, recycling, agriculture in Asia, world toilet problems, etc. Throughout the past 6 months, we at NGO Global Village have observed how visitors, for whom these organizations are at first rather distant, become interested and then start showing willingness to put themselves into action. This is the fruit of past 8 workshops which the secretary and participating organizations held before the exposition, for the purpose of refining presentation techniques to the general public – we are very proud of our visitors' survey result in August, with more than 70% expressing satisfaction.

Candle night

We will make 500 candles, all natural, which will be lit while electric light is lowered and we will reflect over "What we can do from now on?" after 6 months of activities. The candle making workshop is open to anyone, but number of candles is limited to the first 500 participants.
