Comment by Expo Association Secretary General Toshio Nakamura at the Closing Day Press Conference

Today is the 185th and final day of EXPO 2005, and there are now just a few hours left before the Expo comes to a close. The Closing Ceremony was held earlier today with the attendance of the Crown Prince and Prime Minister Junichiro Koizumi.
