Statement by Expo Association Chairman Shoichiro Toyoda on the Closing of EXPO 2005

The highly popular 2005 World Exposition, Aichi, Japan, comes to a close today, 185 days after opening on March 25. I am sincerely grateful to the efforts made by the 125 official participating countries and organizations, domestic participants, and all those concerned who helped make this event a resounding success. I would also like to extend my profound gratitude to the more than 21 million visitors who came to enjoy the Expo from countries around the world.

Under the theme of "Nature's Wisdom," EXPO 2005 explored approaches to tackling issues of global scale confronting humanity and achieving harmony with nature to enable environmentally sustainable development. Visitors have been able to experience leading-edge technologies relating to energy, moving images, and robots and experiment with new social structures and lifestyles.
