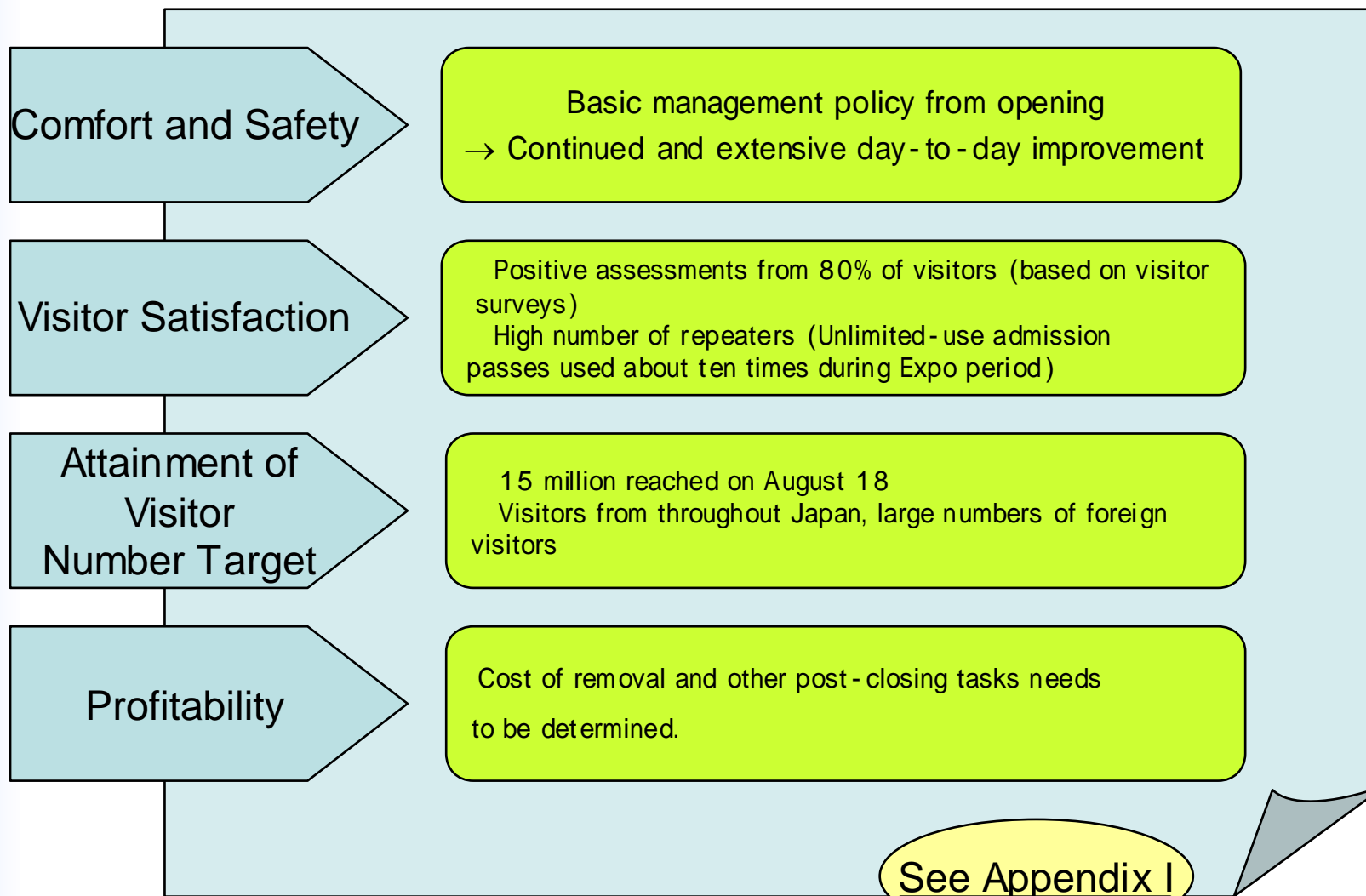

Maintaining a wide range of Influence

- Participation by large number of countries and int'l organizations (expansion of assistance for developing countries)
- Cooperation with international organizations, etc. (Symposium participation by UN, Red Cross, OECD, etc)

Interest shown by overseas

- Large number of foreign VIP visitors
- Frequent exposure and coverage by many overseas Media organizations

Theme-Centered Expo (aiming higher standards)

- Various exhibits and events which express the Theme of Expo (Pavilion construction by host: focus on content)
- Hosting of academic conferences, symposiums, etc.

Declaration of Congratulations and Praise (BIE General Assembly June 24, 2005)



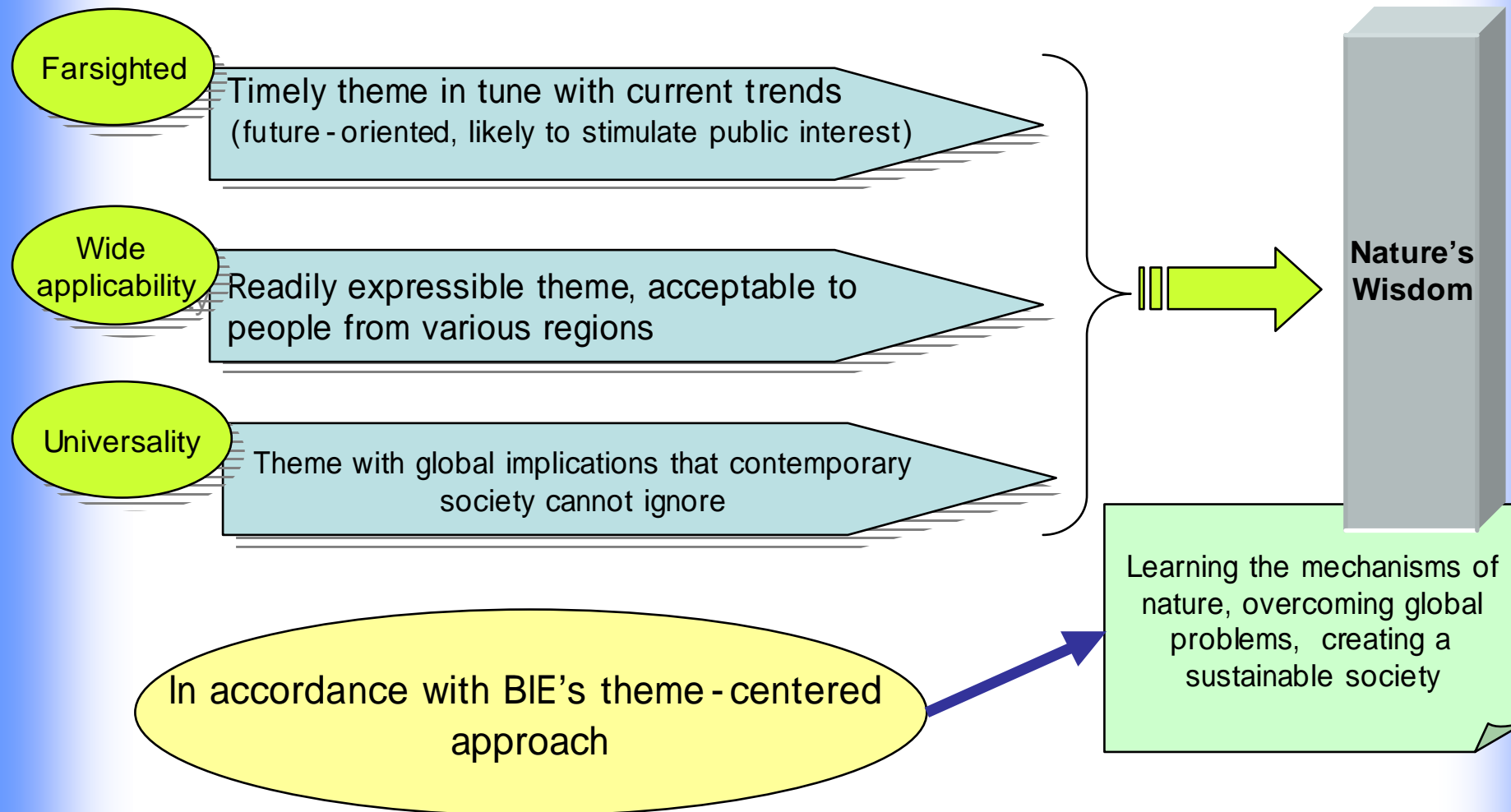
Reference 1: Declaration of Congratulations and Praise (137th BIE General Assembly)

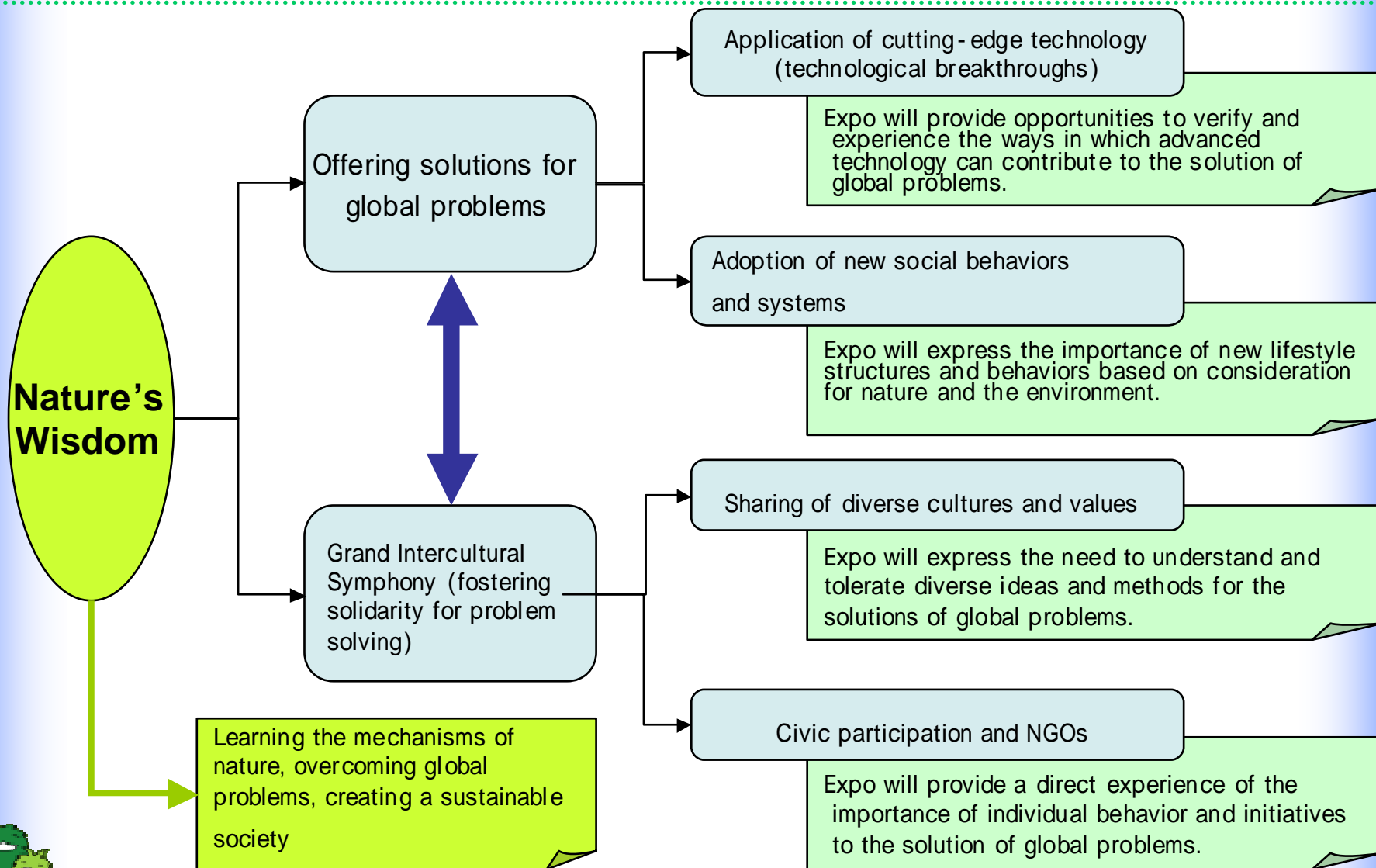

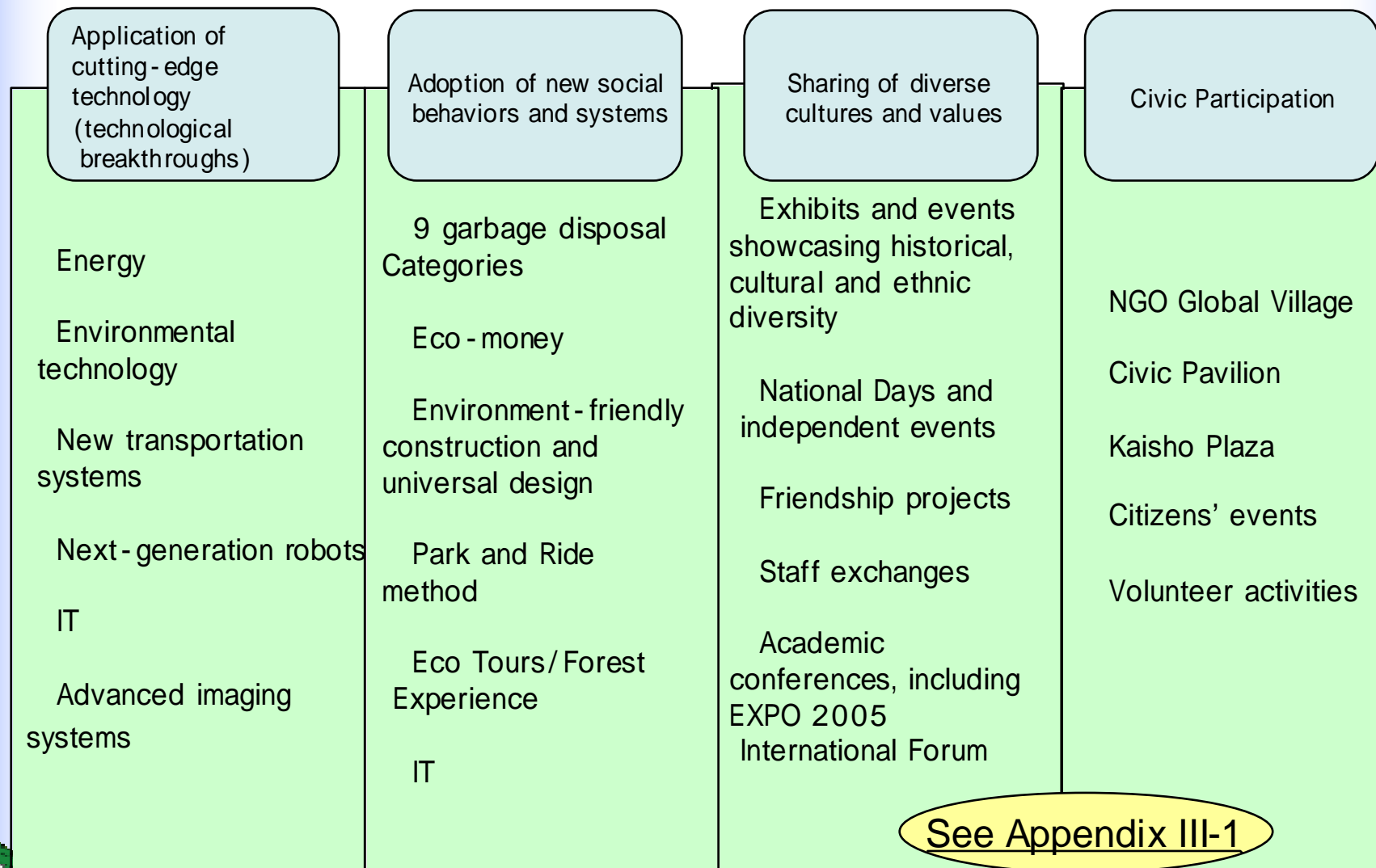
