Global Commons

(venues of exhibits from foreign countries)

Official participating countries and international organizations hold their exhibits here. But the arrangement is markedly different from previous Expos, where each of the countries' display facilities were separate. Here, by contrast, a module system has been incorporated. Each country's exhibition space is placed in groupings of arranged and constructed facilities. The arrangement eases the environmental impact by requiring less construction and processing.

The whole venue will be decorated in the colors of a country! There will also be a Japan Day.

National Days

Cultures and customs are different the world over, as are languages. One of the most enjoyable aspects of a World Exposition is being able to come into contact with a variety of countries around the globe. National Days celebrate the participation of each of the countries taking part in an Expo. Each day visitors will be able to enjoy major events and commemorations of a different country.

Right near the main gate! Start by taking a trip around Asia!

Global Common 1 17 countries from Asia This is the nearest attraction to the North Gate, and it's easily accessible from the Corporate Pavilion Zone. What is more, it is right next door to EXPO Plaza, making its location all the more convenient. A number of Asian countries, including China and South Korea, are taking part. (Southeast Asian countries' pavilions are located in another area.)

Global Common 4 21 countries from Europe This Common is connected to the North Gate by a gondola that offers overhead views of the venue. You can also get there from the Corporate Pavilion Zone by the Intelligent Multimode Transit System (IMTS). This is also home to the EXPO Dome, used to stage largescale events. A number of European countries are featured here.

the Mediterranean

Four entrances, ringed by the Global Loop

This Global Common has four entrances, as the nearest structures are the West Gate and Japan Zone, while the Global Loop passes around the site. The ample use of Mediterranean colors is pleasing to the eye. Countries in and around Europe have their pavilions here.



Where African power and new energy intersect

Global Common 5 African countries and new forms of energy This is a compact and integrated space near the West Gate and Japan Zone. A number of countries in Africa, the cradle of mankind, are gathered here. Both Africa's diversity and solidarity are represented here. Also part of the site is the NEDO Pavilion and New Energy Plant.

Global Common 6 Countries of Oceania and Southeast Asia This is located right beside the North and West Gates, Corporate Pavilion Zone, Japan Zone, and Interactive Fun Zone. Nighttime here is especially enjoyable, as this Common is the closest to Koi-Pond, where evening events are staged. The countries featured here are mainly in Oceania and Southeast Asia.

Pavilion of India 3

In the center is a tree of life called "Tree Light," and on the ceiling is the image of the sun made from traditional cloth. Scenes of a Mandala and a bazaar are portrayed inside the hall.

Pavilion of the Republic of Korea 8

Inside are five booths, each with their own distinctive color: blue (representing water), red (fire), yellow (the soil), black (coal), white (paper). Each color is also connected to an aspect of Korean culture, including history and nature.

◆ Pavilion of the People's Republic of China

The space is based around a plan of a "tree of life." The Chinese people's distinctive view of the world, which involves the harmony of cities and nature, is represented by large plants and circular staircases patterned after the veins of a leaf.

Pavilion of the Kingdom of Nepal 10

On display is a Nepalese Buddhist temple, re-created through the efforts of 200 Nepalese artisans, based on the theme of "Mandala." A panorama of the Himalayas can also been seen.

Pavilion of the United States 1

Lightning, the proof of electricity's existence, is featured, as 2005 marks the 300th anniversary of Benjamin Franklin's birthday. A three-dimensional computer image will serve as the host.



Pavilion of Canada 6

Canadian culture and customs are introduced in this mysterious spherical space, where the theme is "The Wisdom of Diversity." At the Cyber Explorer Salon, visitors can experience Canada virtually through Cyber Explorer Modules.



Pavilion of the United Nations

The theme is Celebrating Diversity. A reproduction of "Guernica," which Picasso painted for the 1937 Paris Expo, is shown on a tapestry of digital images, serving as a symbol of peace.

Pavilion of France

The space is divided into thirds, with each section focusing on long-term sustainable development, while an immersion theater that projects images in six directions question whether there is a "future in the future."

Pavilion of the Republic of Poland

"Etude," a collection of the music of Polishborn composer Chopin, is visualized on more than 10 screens. Glass sculptures inspired by Chopin's music are also displayed.

Pavilion of Russia (B)

The importance of maintaining harmony with the "garden of life" is the central theme, using the examples of natural resources, space travel, disaster prevention technology, and new energy sources such as hydrogen. Traditional folk crafts are also on display.

Nordic Pavilion (5)

With the theme of a "northern oasis," the views of the aurora are projected, together with descriptions of Northern European nature, cuisine, and the creation of an independent welfare society. Do not miss a performance involving a paper ship bearing written messages.
