

Sadako Ogata is President of the Japan International Cooperation Agency. In addition, she chairs the Advisory Board on Human Security, a follow up board to Commission on Human Security which she co-chaired with Nobel Peace Prize laureate Professor Amartya Sen. She also serves as Special Representative of Prime Minister of Japan on Afghanistan Assistance.

Mrs. Ogata served as the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (1991–2000), Representative of Japan on the United Nations Commission on Human Rights (1982), and Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at the Permanent Mission of Japan to the United Nations, where she previously served as Minister (1976).

Prior to her diplomatic career, Mrs. Ogata was Dean of the Faculty of Foreign Studies at Sophia University (1989–91), as well as Director and Professor of the Institute of International Relations at the same university (1981–88).

Born in Tokyo (1927), Mrs. Ogata received a Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of California at Berkeley (1963), an M.A. in International Relations from Georgetown University (1953), and a B.A. from the University of the Sacred Heart in Tokyo (1951).
